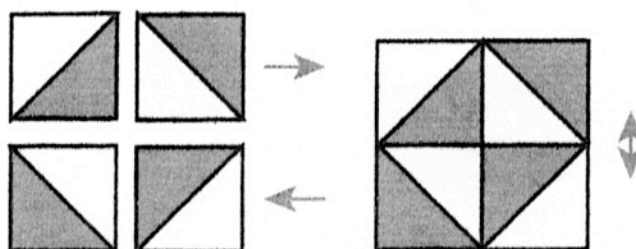
*The Mystery Quilt block for April was published in the February newsletter. Due to the extra "Special Edition" newsletter, we are publishing blocks a month ahead of schedule . . . so here is the last block to complete your Mystery Quilt.*

The June/last block of our Mystery Quilt is a familiar Broken Dishes block using four 2.5 inch half square triangles. Follow the diagram for placement and pressing. If making one block remember to add the 2.5 inch by 4.5 inches sashing strips to each side as well as the 2.5 inch by 8.5 inch sashing strips to the top and bottom. Press to the sashing. If making two or more blocks make as many as you would like. I am making each of my rows the same length as the others. This quilt was designed as a row quilt sampler. But now the design is up to you! Place all your completed blocks in any pattern that is pleasing to you. Maybe a table runner? Maybe a wall hanging? Maybe a quilt (any size imaginable). Add borders as desired. Completed quilt tops will be seen at the August guild picnic. For you overachievers :) there is not a prize if it is entirely finished other than the prize of having a completed project! Yeah!!!

### REMINDER: ALL QUILT REGISTRATION FORMS SHOULD BE IN BY MARCH 9, 2017

**Appraiser/Judging:** Appraisal cost is \$50.00 and it will take ½ hour for your quilt to be appraised. Anyone can walk in to have this done. Guild members will be bumped into another time slot if someone other than a guild member wants to have this done. Appraising is done Saturday and Sunday. About mid March we'll have a final count on how many quilts will be judged.

**Basket/Charity Booth:** Reminder for members to go in with other members to donate a basket. Such as: movie basket, cleaning, dinner, coffee, children's, bird feeder, garden, baking or kitchen basket and so on. Appliqued towels will also be sold. These may be either kitchen or bathroom towels . . . more are still needed.

**Kids Corner:** Fun activities are being planned by Naomi Anderson and Dawn Staszak.

**Quilt Walk:** Group has 28 sites for the quilts to be shown around Manitowoc County. They do need more sites. Contact Mary Kempf or Julie Puestow with the name of your site.

**Set Up and Hauling:** Pam Posvic has the truck for hauling supplies from the PLQ shed She asked that all committees let her know what exactly is needed from the shed for the quilt show. She will be bringing only what is needed. Give Pam the list of items you will need.

**Show Security:** More members are needed for a stay over at the expo Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. PLEASE SIGN UP WITH A MEMBER FRIEND.

**Vendors:** All booths have been filled.

**Work Schedule:** All members are expected to sign up and work at least 2, two-hour shifts during the show. If you have not signed up by the end of the March guild meeting . . . You WILL be called.

**Saturday and Sunday Food:** Please see state food handling rules contained in this newsletter.

**History:** Elaine Nelson needs more pictures of winning quilts done in the past. Mail the pictures to Elaine or turn them in at the guild meeting.

**Gift Boutique:** Just a few reminders for those members who want to sell their wonderful creations in the Gift Boutique:

Any hand made items are welcome, and from what we've seen at "Show and Tell" there appears to be a lot of new items and more members participating. Good luck to everyone!

Each member is limited to a maximum of 12 items in any one category at any one time. As sales are made, your supply may be replenished. Any extra items may be stored underneath the tables and should be placed in boxes or plastic bins with your name thereon.

If you can display your items in a container, i.e., basket, bowl, decorative box – please do so, making sure your name is on the bottom of the container.

The Guild retains 10% of all sales.

An inventory list and sample price tag has been published in previous newsletters (and is available online in the newsletter section of our website). We will have extra lists at the March meeting. Please use this uniform inventory list, as it will be much easier to keep an accurate record of all the sales.

Please number your items consecutively.

**Gift Boutique (continued):** If you have any items for the “Holiday Nook” (which is new this year), would you please put an x mark next to the number on your list. We’d like to have an idea as to how many of the holiday/wintery items were sold.

In addition to the “Holiday Nook”, we will have an area near the cashier’s table for any Eastery items.

Each and every item must have a price tag attached to it. Please set your pricing at full dollar or half-dollar amounts for ease in making change.

Anyone wishing to donate gently used gift bags can bring them to the March meeting. We will donate the tissue paper.

We would like to have three people on each shift. Two at the checkout and one to help the customers and also to keep an eye out for anyone wanting an item but not wanting to pay for it.

## **FOOD STAND WORKER RULES**

1. **General Public may NOT enter food area.**
2. **Handwashing: WASH YOUR HANDS OFTEN**  
Wash hands for 15-20 seconds with warm running water and soap; then dry with paper towels.  
Wash hands:
  - before preparing food
  - after you handle dirty dishes
  - after you handle trash or take out garbage
  - after using cleaning or toxic chemicals
  - after you use the restroom
  - after you eat or take a smoke break
  - after you blow your nose, cough or sneeze**-if your hands touch your nose or mouth**
3. Do NOT handle food with bare hands. Use tongs, deli tissues, or food handling gloves  
Gloves and hand sanitizers are not a replacement for hand washing. Hands must be thoroughly washed each time gloves are replaced.
4. If you handle other things when wearing gloves (money, etc.), you must wash your hands and re-glove.
5. Effective hair restraints, such as a hat or a scarf, must be worn to keep hair in control. (We will have a few available, if you forget.).
6. Jewelry is not permitted on the hands and arms except for a plain wedding band.
7. Keep all foods covered.
8. Stir foods frequently to maintain a safe food temperature.
9. Check food temperatures often (at least hourly). It must be above 135 degrees.
10. Wash hands between handling raw meat and foods that will not be cooked before eating.
11. Wash, rinse, and sanitize the cutting surface and all utensils and knives EVERY TIME you finish with a job or between preparing different foods.
12. Store scoops and tongs with handle extended out of the food.
13. Washing utensils:
  - wash in hot, soapy water
  - rinse in clear water
  - sanitizer rinse
  - air dry

**Any time your gloved hand comes in contact with other surfaces, or your face, you MUST wash hands and change gloves. Be diligent about practicing good food preparation hygiene.**

**Please remember:** These are NOT OUR rules. These procedures are required by the Health Department. A Health Department official may do an inspection during our show, as has been done in the past.
