If you have a Featherweight machine collecting dust or are a dedicated user of your Featherweight, you can create some accessories for it. On Sat November 16 and Sunday Nov 17 we have an open sew day at Ascend and I would like to introduce you to two items you can make to go with your Featherweight machine. You should be able to complete both projects Saturday morning. First, is a cover to place over the bed of your machine to protect the bed from scratches on the thumb screw on the front of the machine. Second, is a bag just the right size to hold your cord and presser foot. This also protects your machine from scratches while transporting it. If this is something you are interested in please let me know so that I can have enough directions printed and I will then send you the supply list.

Guidelines for Quilts for Veterans.

Making a quilt to donate to a veteran? Please keep the following in mind.

- A Lap Quilt is a preferred size for many.
- Keep your colors patriotic and purposeful. True red, white and blue. Deep colors, not pastels.
- Same goes for the prints themselves. No floral, seasonal or religious.
- Please put a label on your quilt

~ Pattern on page 6 ~ ~ quantity: make 1 block ~

This year's mystery quilt features 16 different 10-1/2" blocks, making a quilt that finishes up at 54-1/2" X 54-1/2". There is an additional month for sashing and borders. I began the blocks with 2 yards of background fabric and a whole lot of scraps, so it's another chance to get out that scrap basket. If you are undecided as to whether you want to join in on the mystery, watch the blocks appear each month and decide then. You are always able to get past blocks on our website. Remember to bring your completed blocks to the guild for show and tell! ~Chris Bauknecht



3 ½" TRIM-IT RULER RILEY BLAKE DESIGNS QUILTY TOOLS™ ¼" PLUS RULER

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE, SNF = STITCH AND FLIP

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (8) C squares,
 D squares, and (2) E squares.
- Place (4) C squares onto bottom left corners of
 (4) B rectangles, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners.
- Repeat SNF technique to attach (4) D squares onto bottom right corners of the same B – rectangles to make (4) Flying Geese units measuring 3" x 5 ½" unfinished.





 Place (2) E – squares with (2) F – squares, right sides together. Sew a ¼" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal lines, making (4) E/F HST units. Trim HST units to measure 3" × 3" unfinished.




 Place (4) C – squares with (4) E/F HST units, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners to make (4) SNF units. The SNF units should measure 3" × 3" unfinished.







 Arrange (4) A – squares (4) Flying Geese units, and block center as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press.
 Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 3.
 Block 3 should measure 10 %" × 10 %" unfinished.

QUILT ENTRY RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- A quilt must be quilted through 3 layers (top, batting, backing).
- Pieced, tied guilts are permitted. No whole cloth tied guilts.
- Each quilt/item needs a label attached to the lower left corner as you look at the back of the quilt/item. Labels should include your name and name of the quilt.
- Each item requires a 4" sleeve across the top of the quilt/item for hanging.
- Quilt has not been entered in any Patch of Lakeshore Quilters previous shows.
- Review the quilt show categories (outlined below) and make sure you are choosing the
 correct category. Fill out the registration form completely or it will be returned for you to
 complete. The check-in committee reserves the right to re-categorize any quilt that is
 registered in an incorrect category.
- Quilts must be clean and free of smoke, odor and pet hair. The check-in committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not comply.
- Quilt check-in is Thursday April 3, 2025 at Manitowoc Expo Center from 9am to 6pm for all quilts except Judged quilts.
- **Judged quilts** must be turned in *Wednesday*, *April 2, 2025* between 9-10am at Meadow Lanes North, 1540 Johnston Drive, Manitowoc.
- Quilt check-out begins Sunday, April 6, 2025 after vendors are gone and everything is taken down and cleaned up; not before.

QUILT CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS:

- **Applique**: Hand or Machine. (Applique is easily recognized as the focal point of the quilt.)
- **Art**: entrants own design, produced by one person, with creative thought and without replicating the work of others. May be untraditional in construction and appearance.
- **Challenge**: The challenge quilt must follow the theme of the show: Garden Party. Must use a recognizable amount of any floral fabric in the piece. Must be in quilt form (3 layer sandwich) with an overall measurement not to exceed 100" in perimeter (ex: 25x25x25x25). No kits are allowed.
- Embroidered: Hand or Machine. (Embroidery is easily the focal point of the quilt.)
- **Group**: Quilt top is put together by 2 or more people, may include block exchanges, Round Robins or multi-generational quilts. Include names of all participants.
- Miscellaneous quilted item: purse, table runner, garment, wool mats, etc
- Novice: quilter with 1-2 years of quilting experience
- Youth: 18 years and under
- **Quilts for Veterans**: quilt made for a veteran, active or retired. Quilts for Veterans will be presented to selected veterans on Sunday, April 6.
- Traditional pieced: Hand or Machine Piecing dominates over other techniques
 Indicate quilting method: Personally Machine or Hand Quilted by yourself
 Professionally Quilted by someone else
 - Indicate quilt width: Small (width up to 50"), Med. (width 50-69"), Large (width over 69")
- 2022-23 and 2023-24 Guild Mystery Quilt: Mystery quilt as given by the guild in recent years
