Gift Boutique

- For those members, especially our newest members, wanting to sell their wonderful creations in the Gift Boutique, any handmade items made by you are welcome. Here's a chance to showcase your talents and earn a bit of money to support your fabric habit!
- Any member is limited to display at any one time, a maximum of 12 items in any one of your categories. As sales are made, your supply may be replenished. Any extra items may be stored underneath the tables and should be placed in boxes or plastic bins with your name on it.
- If you can display your items in a container, i.e., basket, bowl, decorative box please do so, and put your name on the bottom of the container.
- The Guild retains 10% of all sales.
- An inventory list and sample price tag will be published in a future newsletter. We will also have them at upcoming meetings. We want you to use this uniform inventory list, as it will be much easier to keep an accurate record of all the sales.
- As to the price tags, Walmart has a box of 100 strung marking tags, by Avery, 1 3/4" x 1 3/32", No. 6732.
- Please number your items consecutively.
- Each and every item must have a price tag attached to it with a safety pin. Please set your pricing at full dollar or half-dollar amounts for ease in making change.
- Anyone still wishing to donate gently used gift bags can bring them to our meetings. We will donate the tissue paper.
- We would like to have three people on each shift. Two at the checkout and one to help the customers by walking around and keeping an eye out for anyone wanting an item and "forgetting" to pay for it.
- You, or the person dropping off your items, will be asked to sign a disclaimer. The drop-off dates and times will be announced later.



SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE


- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (6) A squares.
- 2. Place (1) A square with (1) B square, right sides together. Sew a ¼" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal line. Cut along the drawn diagonal line, making (2) A/B HST units. Trim HST units to measure 3" × 3" unfinished.




3. Repeat HST unit assembly to make (2) A/D HST units, (2) A/E HST units, (2) A/F HST units, (2) A/I HST units, and (2) A/J HST units. Trim HST units to measure 3" × 3" unfinished.




4. Arrange (3) HST units and (1) C- square as shown. Sew the units together in pairs. Press in direction of arrows. Then sew the pairs together and press to complete block unit. The block unit should measure 5 1/2" × 5 1/2" unfinished.



5. Repeat Step 4 with remaining HST units and (1) G - square, (1) H - square, and (1) K - square to make three more block units. The block units should measure 5 1/2" × 5 1/2" unfinished.



6. Arrange (4) block units as shown. Sew the units together in pairs and press. Then sew the pairs together and press to complete Block 5. Block 5 should measure 10 1/2" × 10 1/2" unfinished.



*Due to the hand-crafted nature of batiks, fabric may vary from images.
