# Should I get my quilt judged?

Many people are nervous about having their quilts judged. They may be worried that their work is not "good enough" or they may not be happy having someone else tell them what is wrong with their piece. Although these are completely understandable, I would like to encourage you to enter your quilts in the upcoming show AND to have them undergo the judging process!

When a judge looks at a quilt, she is an independent, un-biased individual who is looking at your quilt with the idea of ranking your quilt against the others in the category, but also with the idea of giving helpful comments that can move you further along in your quilting career.

In almost every case, the judge's first comment is about something good in your quilt. It may be your design, your choice of colors, or the subject matter of the quilt.

She will then start looking at more detail, assessing the skill level that you have brought to your creation. Yes, she may say something that you do not like or agree with, but in most cases, she will give feedback that you can use to make a better quilt the next time.

My suggestion to each of you is that you make the very best quilt that you can make (knowing that your skill is slowly improving) and submit them proudly for judging. Remember that we all started out slow…even the judge!

# Set up and Show Schedule

The below schedule is meant to give members an overview of the Quilt Show weekend. **Times and details are subject to change/correction.** 

#### Wednesday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>

9 am to 10 am – Judged quilts\* delivered to <u>Meadow Lanes North</u> (1540 Johnston Dr., Manitowoc). If you are not available during this time, arrange with another member to drop off your quilt/s for you.

\*Have quilts folded with the label exposed.

#### Thursday, April 3rd

*9 am to 6:00 pm* – Check in quilts.\* Quilts must be brought in today; labeled and with a hanging sleeve.

\*Have quilts folded with the label exposed.

- 10 am to 6:30 pm Deliver themed baskets and handmade items for sale in the charity booth. Items will also be accepted on Friday.
- 12 Noon to 6:45 pm Deliver gift boutique items.

(??)6:45 pm – Guild meeting at Expo Center (??)

*Tasks throughout the day* - Tables set up to receive quilts, poles and bases assembled (muscles and tools needed!), floor taped for layout, pipes and curtains prepped/put up, and general prep work in the kitchen.

\*\*\*Remaining raffle tickets and money MUST be returned before the show opens.\*\*\*

#### Friday, April 4th

8 am to Finish – Quilt show set up. Everyone helps. If you can only help for a couple hours, please come; every little bit of help is needed.

*Tasks throughout the day* continue - Poles with bases placed, pipes and curtains prepped/put up, quilts hung up, tables moved to vendor areas, and other fine tuning.

Individual committees set up their areas.

9:00 am to 12 Noon – Deliver gift boutique items.

9:00 am to 11:00 am - Drop off Friday food donations.

12 Noon – Take Tylenol as our feet will hurt.

- 4 pm Vendors start coming to set up
- Any ladder-climbing, able body persons are welcome at any time to hang lights and/or quilts.
- \*\*\*Remaining raffle tickets and money MUST be returned before the show opens.\*\*\*

## Gift Boutique

- For those members, especially our newest members, wanting to sell their wonderful creations in the Gift Boutique, any handmade items made by you are welcome. Here's a chance to showcase your talents and earn a bit of money to support your fabric habit!
- Any member is limited to display at any one time, a maximum of 12 items in any one of your categories. As sales are made, your supply may be replenished. Any extra items may be stored underneath the tables and should be placed in boxes or plastic bins with your name on it.
- If you can display your items in a container, i.e., basket, bowl, decorative box please do so, and put your name on the bottom of the container.
- The Guild retains 10% of all sales.
- An inventory list and sample price tag will be published in a future newsletter. We will also have them at upcoming meetings. We want you to use this uniform inventory list, as it will be much easier to keep an accurate record of all the sales.
- As to the price tags, Walmart has a box of 100 strung marking tags, by Avery, 1 3/4" x 1 3/32", No. 6732.
- Please number your items consecutively.
- Tag should include item number, price and member's last name.
- Each and every item must have a price tag attached to it with a safety pin. Please set your pricing at full dollar or half-dollar amounts for ease in making change.
- Anyone still wishing to donate gently used gift bags can bring them to our meetings. We will donate the tissue paper.
- We would like to have three people on each shift. Two at the checkout and one to help the customers by walking around and keeping an eye out for anyone wanting an item and "forgetting" to pay for it.
- You, or the person dropping off your items, will be asked to sign a disclaimer. The drop-off dates and times will be announced later.
- You will receive your money in the form of a check at a future guild meeting or in the mail.

- Location: Camp Tapawingo, 915 W. Tapawingo Road, Mishicot
- Three days of sewing/quilting/preparing for projects that you bring/sharing ideas/conversations/eating with fellow quilters. Bring your projects, sewing machine and whatever you need to work on your projects. Some choose to stay overnight, others go home and return each day.
- **Overnighting?:** Two large bunk rooms, with showers and toilets, are available downstairs. Bring your own bed linens, towels and toiletries.
- **Provided**: Irons (water)/ironing boards/cutting tables/mats provided.
- **Breakfast**: (optional) Friday, March 21 meet at 8:00 am Two Rivers Family Restaurant, 3015 Tannery Road, Two Rivers. Anyone wanting to join us before we go out to camp, you are responsible to pay for your own meal. If you are not meeting for breakfast, camp will open approx. 9:20am.



#### SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

**SNF** = STITCH AND FLIP

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (16) B squares and (8) F - squares.
- 2. Arrange (4) A rectangles and (4) C – rectangles as shown. Sew pieces together and press in direction of arrow to form (4) pieced units. The units should measure  $3\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{2}$  unfinished.

- 3. Align (4) B squares with top right corner of (4) pieced units, right sides together. Sew on the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to 1/4". Press toward the corners to make (4) A/C SNF units.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3, arranging pieces as shown, to make (4) A/D SNF units. The units should measure 3 1/2" × 3 1/2" unfinished.

**Rilev** Blake

- 5. Draw a diagonal line through opposite corners as B squares, on the wrong side of (4) A/D SNF units.
- 6. Place (4) A/D SNF units with (4) A/C SNF units, right sides together and with B - squares on top of each other. Draw a diagonal line through opposite corners as B - squares. Sew on the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners to make (4) corner units that measure 3 1/2" × 3 ½" unfinished.





7. Repeat SNF technique, aligning (8) B - squares and (8) F - squares with opposite corners of (8) E - rectangles to make (4) B/F SNF units and (4) mirror-image B/F SNF units. The units should measure 2 1/2"  $\times 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

Sew together and press to make (4) side

units. The side units should measure

3 1/2" × 4 1/2" unfinished.



9. Arrange (4) corner units, (4) side units, and (1) G - square as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 6. Block 6 should measure 10 ½" × 10 ½" unfinished.
