Gift Boutique

- For those members, especially our newest members, wanting to sell their wonderful creations in the Gift Boutique, any handmade items made by you are welcome. Here's a chance to showcase your talents and earn a bit of money to support your fabric habit!
- Any member is limited to display at any one time, a maximum of 12 items in any one of your categories. As sales are made, your supply may be replenished. Any extra items may be stored underneath the tables and should be placed in boxes or plastic bins with your name on it.
- If you can display your items in a container, i.e., basket, bowl, decorative box – please do so, and put your name on the bottom of the container.
- The Guild retains 10% of all sales.
- An inventory list and sample price tag will be published in a future newsletter. We will also have them at upcoming meetings. We want you to use this uniform inventory list, as it will be much easier to keep an accurate record of all the sales.
- As to the price tags, Walmart has a box of 100 strung marking tags, by Avery, 1 3/4" x 1 3/32", No. 6732.
- o Please number your items consecutively.
- Each and every item must have a price tag attached to it with a safety pin.
 Please set your pricing at full dollar or half-dollar amounts for ease in making change.
- Anyone still wishing to donate gently used gift bags can bring them to our meetings. We will donate the tissue paper.
- We would like to have three people on each shift. Two at the checkout and one to help the customers by walking around and keeping an eye out for anyone wanting an item and "forgetting" to pay for it.
- You, or the person dropping off your items, will be asked to sign a disclaimer. The drop-off dates and times will be announced later.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric 1:

- A (4) 3" squares
- B (2) 4" squares

Fabric 2:


C − (2) 4" squares

Fabric 3:

- D − (2) 3 ½" squares
- E − (4) 3" squares

Fabric 4:

- F (2) 3 ½" squares
- G (2) 3" × 5 ½" rectangles



ADDITIONAL TOOLS NEEDED:

BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES
3 ½" TRIM-IT RULER
10 ½" TRIM-IT RULER




SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE, SNF = STITCH AND FLIP


- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (2) B squares,
 D squares, (4) E squares, and (2) F squares.
- Place (2) B squares with (2) C squares, right sides together.
 Sew a ¾" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal lines, making (4) B/C HST units. Trim HST units to measure 3 ½" × 3 ½" unfinished.




 Repeat HST unit assembly with (2) D – squares and (2) B/C HST units to make (4) B/C/D HST units. The HST units will be mirror images of each other. Trim HST units to measure 3" × 3" unfinished.




 Repeat HST unit assembly with (2) F – squares and (2) B/C HST units to make (4) B/C/F HST units. The HST units will be mirror images of each other. Trim HST units to measure 3" × 3" unfinished.



- Place (2) E squares onto the left side of (2) G rectangles, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners.
- Repeat SNF technique to attach (2) E squares onto the right side of the same G – rectangles to make (2) Flying Geese units measuring 3" x 5 ½" unfinished.



Arrange (4) A – squares (4) B/C/D HST units, (4) B/C/F HST units, and (2) Flying Geese units as shown. Sew B/C/F HST units in pairs. Press in direction of arrows. Sew the pieces together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 4. Block 4 should measure
 10 %" × 10 %" unfinished.
