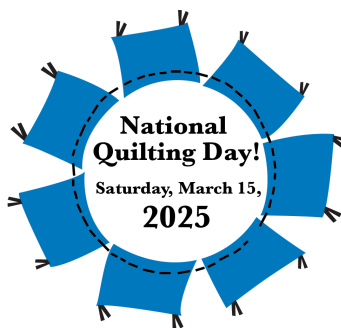

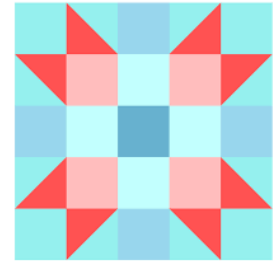

Set up and Show Schedule

The below schedule is meant to give members an overview of the Quilt Show weekend. **Times and details are subject to change/correction.**

Wednesday, April 2nd

9 am to 10 am – **Judged quilts*** delivered to **Manitowoc Expo Center**. If you are not available during this time, arrange with another member to drop off your quilt/s for you. *Have quilts folded with the label exposed.

Thursday, April 3rd

9 am to 6:00 pm – Check in quilts.* Quilts must be brought in today; labeled and with a hanging sleeve. *Have quilts folded with the label exposed.

10 am to 6:30 pm – Deliver themed baskets and handmade items for sale in the charity booth. Items will also be accepted on Friday.

12 Noon to 6:45 pm – Deliver gift boutique items.

Tasks throughout the day 7 am to evening - Tables set up to receive quilts, poles and bases assembled (muscles and tools needed!), floor taped for layout, pipes and curtains prepped/put up, and general prep work in the kitchen.

Remaining raffle tickets and money MUST be returned before the show opens.

Set up and Show Schedule continued

Friday, April 4th

7 am to Finish – Quilt show set up. Everyone helps. If you can only help for a couple hours, please come; every little bit of help is needed.

Tasks throughout the day continue - Poles with bases placed, pipes and curtains prepped/put up, quilts hung up, tables moved to vendor areas, and other fine tuning.

Individual committees set up their areas.

9:00 am to 12 Noon – Deliver gift boutique items.

9:00 am to 11:00 am - Drop off Friday food donations.

12 Noon – Take Tylenol as our feet will hurt.

4 pm - Vendors start coming to set up

Any ladder-climbing, able body persons are welcome at any time to hang lights and/or quilts.

Remaining raffle tickets and money MUST be returned before the show opens.

Saturday, April 5th & Sunday April 6th – 9:00 am – 3:00 pm - Show Open!

Remember each guild member is asked to work two 3-hour shifts during the run of the show. If you still need to volunteer or have questions about when you work please call Ellen Lewellen.

Saturday, April 5th

9 am – Drop off Saturday and Sunday bars

9 am to 3 pm - Quilt Show open

Sunday, April 6th

9 am to 3 pm - Quilt Show open

1 pm – Quilts for Veterans presentation

3 pm – Show closes. Pick name for raffle quilt winner. Good luck everyone.

3 pm – Vendor pack up. PLQ members help as needed.

4 pm – Once ALL vendors are out, everyone helps take down quilts. After all quilts are down and the display area is cleared and packed, quilts will be returned to their owners. This takes about a couple hours. Many hands make light work, but we also want to be safe when moving the pipes and poles.

6:30 pm – Home with our feet up and enjoying our favorite beverage.

An inventory list and sample price tag was published in the February newsletter, and is also available on the website. Please use this uniform inventory list, as it will be much easier to keep an accurate record of all the sales.

We’d like to encourage the new members and also those members having items in the Gift Boutique to sign up for a shift. Or, at least try to sell on Saturday or Sunday, even if for a half hour or so.

If any member is also donating an identical or similar item to the charity booth, please price the donated item the same, so that the Gift Boutique and Charity Booth are not competing with each other.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric 1:

- A – (4) 3 ¼" squares
- B – (4) 3 ¼" x 5" rectangles
- C – (1) 3 ⅝" square, cut in half diagonally twice*
- D – (2) 2 ¼" squares, cut in half diagonally once*

Fabric 2:

- E – (2) 2 ¾" squares

Fabric 3:

- F – (2) 2 ¾" squares

Fabric 4:

- G – (2) 2 ¾" squares

Fabric 5:

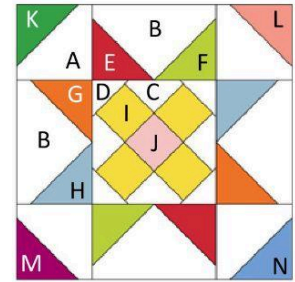
- H – (2) 2 ¾" squares

Fabric 6:

- I – (4) 2" squares

Fabric 7:

- J – (1) 2" square



Fabric 8:

- K – (1) 2 ¾" square

Fabric 9:

- L – (1) 2 ¾" square

Fabric 10:

- M – (1) 2 ¾" square

Fabric 11:

- N – (1) 2 ¾" square

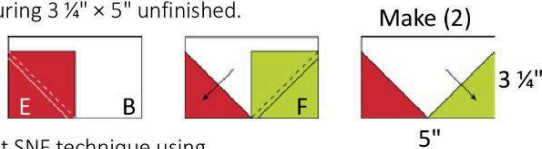
BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES 10 ½" TRIM-IT RULER
RILEY BLAKE DESIGNS QUILTY TOOLS™ ¼" PLUS RULER

*Note: C and D have been slightly oversized for EASE for assembly. If you prefer to use a scant seam allowance, the original cutting found on the Master Cutting sheet is usable.

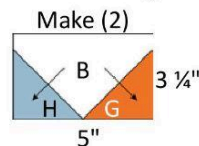
SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

SNF = STITCH AND FLIP

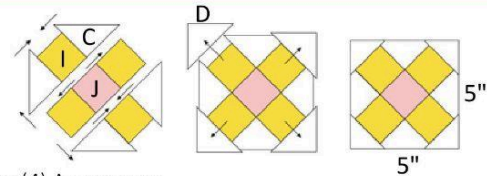
1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (2) E – squares, (2) F – squares, (2) G – squares, (2) H – squares, (1) K – square, (1) L – square, (1) M – square, and (1) N – square.
2. Place (2) E – squares onto bottom left corners of (2) B – rectangles, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners.
3. Repeat SNF technique to attach (2) F – squares onto bottom right corners of the same B – rectangles to make (2) SNF units measuring 3 ¼" x 5" unfinished.



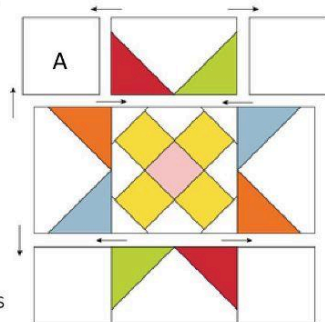
4. Repeat SNF technique using remaining B – rectangles, H – squares and G – squares to make (2) SNF units measuring 3 ¼" x 5" unfinished.



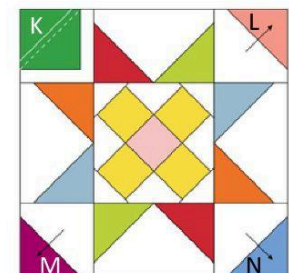
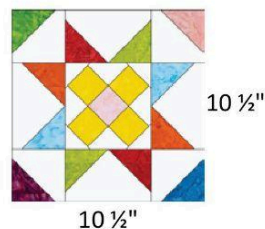
5. Arrange (4) C – triangles, (4) I – squares, and (1) J – square as shown. Sew the pieces together in diagonal rows. Press in direction of arrows. Then sew the rows together and press. Add (4) D – triangles to each corner and press to complete block center. Trim the block center to measure 5" x 5" unfinished.



6. Arrange (4) A – squares, (4) SNF units, and block center as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to make block. The block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½" unfinished.



7. Repeat SNF technique to attach (1) K – square, (1) L – square, (1) M – square, and (1) N – square onto corners of block to complete Block 7. Block 7 should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½" unfinished.



**Due to the hand-crafted nature of batiks, fabric may vary from images.
