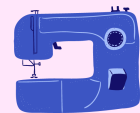
Coleslaw recipe from camp:

~ Pattern on page 6 ~ quantity: make 1 block ~

This year's mystery quilt features 16 different 10-1/2" blocks, making a quilt that finishes up at 54-1/2" X 54-1/2". There is an additional month for sashing and borders. I began the blocks with 2 yards of background fabric and a whole lot of scraps, so it's another chance to get out that scrap basket. If you are undecided as to whether you want to join in on the mystery, watch the blocks appear each month and decide then. You are always able to get past blocks on our website. Remember to bring your completed blocks to the guild for show and tell!

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric 1:

- A – (2) 3" squares
- B – (2) 4" squares
- C – (4) 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric 2:

- D – (2) 3" squares
- E – (1) 4" square

Fabric 3:

- F – (1) 4" square

Fabric 4:

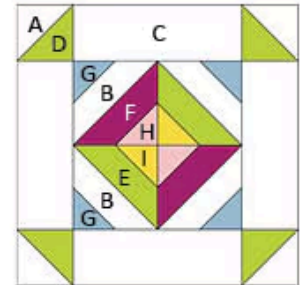
- G – (4) 2" squares

Fabric 5:

- H – (2) 2" squares

Fabric 6:

- I – (2) 2" squares



ADDITIONAL TOOLS NEEDED:

BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES	2 ½" TRIM-IT RULER
6 ½" TRIM-IT RULER	10 ½" TRIM-IT RULER
3 ½" TRIM-IT RULER	RILEY BLAKE DESIGNS QUILTY TOOLS™ ¼" PLUS RULER

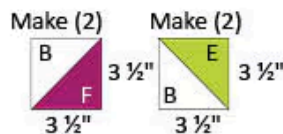
SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE, SNF = STITCH AND FLIP

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (2) A – squares, (2) B – squares, (4) G – squares, (2) H – squares, and (2) I – squares.
2. Place (2) A – squares with (2) D – squares, right sides together. Sew a ¼" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal lines, making (4) A/D HST units. Trim HST units to measure 2 ½" x 2 ½" unfinished.

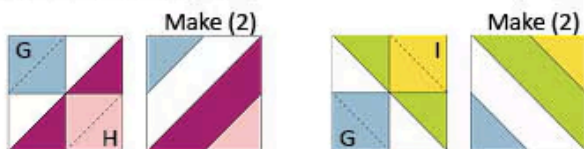


3. Repeat the 2-at-a-time HST method to make (2) B/F and (2) B/E HST units. Trim HST units to measure 3 ½" x 3 ½" unfinished.

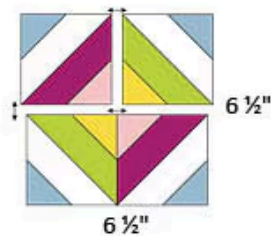


4. Align (2) G – squares with white corners and (2) H – squares with fuchsia corners of (2) B/F HST units, right sides together. Sew on the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners to make (2) SNF units.

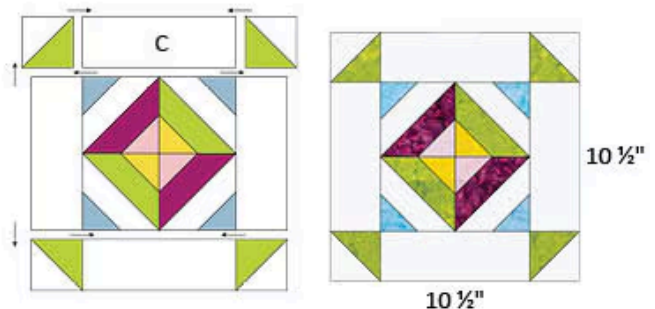
5. Repeat SNF unit assembly, aligning (2) G – squares with white corners and (2) I – squares with lime corners of (2) B/E HST units to make (2) SNF units.



6. Arrange (4) SNF units as shown. Sew the units together in pairs. Press in direction of arrows. Then sew the pairs together and press to complete block center. The block center should measure 6 ½" x 6 ½" unfinished.



7. Arrange (4) A/D HST units, (4) C – rectangles, and block center as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to complete. The Sparkle and Shine Block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½" unfinished.
